#### 79% PLACEMENT RATE

Of the recent graduates that indicated they were seeking employment, 79% reported successful employment within six months of graduation<sup>\*</sup>.

The Center for Student Professional Development (CSPD) surveys students and works with academic departments, student organizations and the Temple University Career Center to track post-graduation outcomes. Information is also collected via LinkedIn and other sources. During the COVID-19 pandemic, the Fox School achieved a total outcomes knowledge rate<sup>†</sup> of 82% and 1000+ Fox graduates are working in full-time business-related roles.
